

Lanercost Festival of Music
Young Musicians' Competition, Saturday 26th June 2010

SYLLABUS and RULES

1. There are two classes:
Class 1 (guideline grade 7/8 standard). Competitors must be under 19 years of age on the date of the competition.
Class 2 (guideline grade 5/6 standard). Competitors must be under 15 years of age on the date of the competition.
2. The following are eligible: piano solo, strings, woodwind, brass, guitar, accordion, vocal, tuned percussion.
3. Competitors will be asked to perform a programme of two or three contrasting pieces (or songs) of their own choice, the programme must be of no more than twelve minutes in class 1, and of no more than ten minutes in class 2.
4. Competitors may enter more than one instrument, but only one class.
5. Competitors may bring their own accompanist or ask for the official accompanist. If the official accompanist is required, a printed copy of the music (not a photocopy) must be enclosed with the entry.
6. Competitors must provide a further copy of the music on the day of the competition, for the adjudicator. Under certain circumstances this may be a photocopy (see below), but must be legible.
7. In the event of the competition being oversubscribed, you may be asked to audition. The Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry, in which case the entry fee will be returned.
8. Children under 16 years must at all times be in the charge of a responsible adult.

COPIES OF MUSIC FOR THE ADJUDICATOR

The Music Publishers Association (MPA) has recently issued a revised Code of Practice on copying copyright works and the following concession is made for copying pieces from volumes only for the adjudicator. Other items must not be photocopied without the permission of the copyright holder.

“When an ‘Own Choice’ work is not published separately, one copy may be made for the use of an adjudicator at a competition or Festival provided that the competitor or participant has already purchased his/her copy and that the copy made is retained and destroyed by the Administrator of the Competition or Festival immediately after the event.” Competitors are advised that this permission applies only to copyright holders who are members of MPA (listed on their website at www.mpaonline.org.uk/code_ofp.html). It is the competitor’s own responsibility to obtain permission to copy from any copyright holder whose name is not on the MPA list. Single copies of items may not be photocopied without prior permission from the copyright holder.
